

TCC Region Wildfire Update

Monday, August 31, 2020

Continued moist weather and typical late-season conditions have led to low fire activity across the region. Most Alaska fire crew resources have been assigned to wildland fire incidents elsewhere in the U.S.

This will be the last TCC Region wildland fire situation update for 2020 unless things change and fire activity increases.

Statewide Summary:

Weather (Extracted from AICC Fire Weather Info):

Central and Eastern Interior: A decaying low will move into the interior this morning and remain in the area through Tuesday spreading showers across the area with increased potential for Wetting Rain. Strong winds near the Alaska Range will diminish by afternoon. Relative Humidity values will generally remain above 30 percent with excellent overnight recovery.

Western Interior: A strong low, remnants of a typhoon, will track through the Western Interior today. With this low, it will bring rain for much of the region over the next several days. Temperatures trending cooler than normal today and will remain so through the week with minimum RH values remaining above 55 percent with excellent overnight recovery.
